# 58'08: Equality... Bring It On!

### 2.1 The Concept

The 58 Legal Instruments highlighted in the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission (HREOC) report <u>Same-Sex: Same Entitlements</u>, National Inquiry Into Discrimination Against People In Same-Sex Relationships: Financial and Work Related Entitlements and Benefits:

For the 2008 Sydney Gay & Lesbian Mardi Gras parade, <u>ethel varwood enterprises (eye)</u> <<u>http://www.yarwood.com.au</u>> will be collaborating with the <u>Gay & Lesbian Rights Lobby</u> (<u>GLRL</u>) <<u>http://www.glrl.org.au</u>> to present a parade entry in 2 parts - **58'08: Equality... Bring It On**!

Inspired by the teen hit movie Bring it On!, the Gay & Lesbian Rights Lobby will be bringing its 58'08 campaign message to life this Mardi Gras. After winning the award for Most Creative Entry at last year's Mardi Gras, the Lobby will be stepping up its float credentials with a cheerleader-led float highlighting the 58 laws which discriminate against same-sex couples and their children.

Dressed in pink, white and black costumes with 58'08 printed on the front and back, a troupe of equality cheerleaders will be lead our marching entry to a soundtrack of satirical chants highlighting discrimination against same-sex couples and their children.

The GLRL is working in partnership with ethel yarwood enterprises, best known for their humorous award winning entries, including the Karma Kleaners in 2007 (Creative Director's Award) and the Kate Moss Line Dancers in 2006 (Funniest Parade Entrant) <<u>http://www.yarwood.com.au/mardigras</u>>. ethel yarwood enterprises will be following the Lobby's float entry with a 58'08 marching group dressed to reflect the 58 discriminatory laws, as highlighted by the final report of the Australian Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission's Same-Sex: Same Entitlements report.

Bringing stories from the Same-Sex Same Entitlements report to life, people who made submissions to the Human Rights and Equal Opportunities Commission will be invited to march with the GLRL under a banner bearing the exact piece of legislation which discriminates against them, their partner or their family.

This year the float promises to be satirical, energetic and send a serious message that 58 laws which discriminate against same-sex couples and their children must be changed by the end of 2008.

### 2.2 The Message

**JOURNALIST**: Mr Rudd, Mr Turnbull has promised that he would press within the Government (inaudible) and that we have discrimination of superannuation for gay couples (inaudible) this was a promise the Government made in fact three years ago and hasn't yet been implemented. Do you commit Labor to implement in all 58 (inaudible) remove discrimination against gay couples throughout our Commonwealth law?

**KEVIN07**: We have said that we will remove all the discriminations concerning same sex couples when it comes to inheritance laws, social security law and other categories, I don't have the list of 58 in front of me but can I say it's a very extensive list that we have committed to. Furthermore can I say on this question. Once again we have the old Liberal Party walking both sides of the street. If you look and see what Mr Turnbull's been saying locally about the rights and entitlements of same sex couples in Wentworth, and contrast with what the Government is saying in other quarters. I'm quite concerned that Mr Turnbull himself is walking both sides of the street on this one.

Now that the Labor Party is in government, we are here to remind them of that commitment. **58'08: Equality... Bring It On**!

### 3. Parade

The 2008 Mardi Gras parade will be realised in 4 sections behind 4 planets: the Red Planet for HIV support groups, the Home Planet (Green), the Animal Planet and the Freedom Planet (White). The Freedom section is the most appropriate for our group. If possible will request that the Mardi Gras parade committee place our combined parade entry at number 58 if this falls into the Freedom section.

## 3.1 Participants

For the yarwood component at least, 58 people, each carrying an A2 placard. Each placard lists one of the 58 laws that require amendment. We will also investigate the possibility of including people who have been discriminated by specific pieces of legislation and have them carry the placard related experience.

### 3.2 Costumes

### Marchers

A t-shirt in the colour designated by the MG parade committee associated with that section of the parade.

The t-shirt is printed with the "De" logo. The participant can then accessorise their costume in keeping with the placard. For example military garb to tie in with Defence Force themed placards.
